A Little Network History

- ◆ The roots of NME go back to the early 1990s with groups like the Michigan Teacher Forum (MTF) and the Michigan Milken Educator Network (MMEN). Both worked to bring recognized teachers together with a central purpose to enhance teaching and learning in Michigan.
- ◆ In 2002, State Board President, Kathy Straus, and the Michigan Department of Education requested that the Network be expanded from the very successful Milken Educator Network to include all recognition programs coordinated or connected with the MDE.
- ◆ At a December 2003 Instructional Leadership and Recognition Conference and Banquet, 67 Recognized Educators from eight different State level awards programs formed The Network Of Michigan Educators (NME) and 14 attendees volunteered to be the first Steering Committee.
- ◆ The Steering Committee now meets five times a year in Lansing, conducts research for MDE, SBE, MVU, etc., coordinates several adult learning community Special Project Teams, provides members to serve on a wide variety of task forces and committees, and the Network holds an annual conference and recognition Banquet.
